The Bay Restoration Fund provides grants to homeowners to purchase, install, and maintain Best Available Technology Biological Nutrient Removal systems in their septic systems. While most homeowners with septic systems are qualified to apply for funding, priority is given to homes in the Critical Area (land within 1000ft from tidal water) with failing systems.
